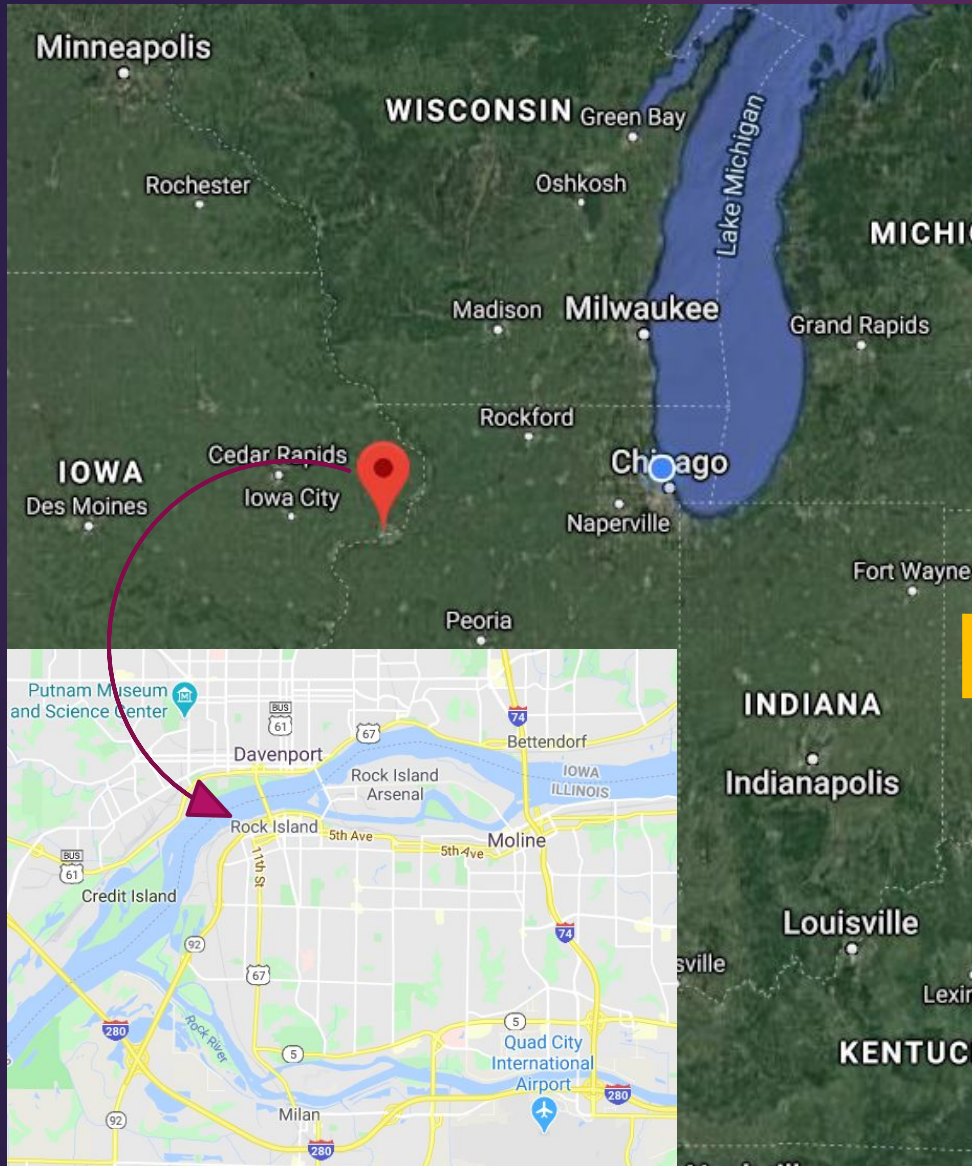

## Classics at Augustana College

### Why Classics?

Classics is the study of everything to do with ancient Greek and Roman culture, from language (Greek and Latin) to history, law, literature, religion, philosophy, art, archaeology and more. As Classics is the foundation for the liberal arts, classical studies is the height of a liberal arts education.

### Why Augustana?

At Augustana, many students take advantage of the college's emphasis on teaching and advising to have two or more majors or minors. Classics is an excellent choice for a double major. Recent Classics majors have combined their studies with accounting, anthropology, art history, biology/pre-medicine, business, chemistry, communication sciences and disorders, computer science, English, French, geology, German, history, mathematics, music, philosophy and religion.

The three faculty members in Classics all have doctorates and specialize in a wide range of complementary areas: Greek and Roman history, Greek and Roman religion and early Christianity, women in classical antiquity, and Classics and pop culture. Complementary courses also are offered in ancient philosophy; ancient history; art history; New Testament studies; and women, gender and sexuality studies.

Augustana's international programs range from yearlong exchange programs to J-term, to special programs based on interest. Classics majors often participate in international study—recently in archaeological field schools in Greece, Italy and Bulgaria, the College Year in Athens program, and Augustana's own faculty-led programs in Greece and Rome—and can use their Augie Choice \$2,000 for expenses.

### Career preparation

Classics is a practical choice for the job market, providing excellent preparation for careers in law, medicine, publishing, seminary, library sciences and more. The demand for knowledge of Greek and Latin also has created a need for qualified teachers in these areas, especially when their studies are combined with other fields.

Students who wish to pursue graduate study in Classics-related fields may go on to specialize in Classics, classical archaeology, ancient history, New Testament studies, art history, comparative literature or ancient philosophy.

# Departmental Open House and Scholarship Competition

High school seniors and transfer students planning to enroll at Augustana for the fall of 2022 are invited to participate in an **Academic Departmental Open House and Scholarship Competition**.

Two competitions will be held, one on Nov. 13, 2021, and a second on Feb. 12, 2022.

More than 30 academic departments from 90 majors and other programs will be your hosts. Learn about your chosen program and compete for a share of more than \$500,000 in departmental scholarships. Scholarship winners are awarded \$4,000 (\$1,000 a year for four years).

Here's an idea of what to expect during the competition:

- Students interested in geology perform a dramatic geologic experiment.
- Future journalists gather clues and report on a crime.
- Artists present a portfolio of their work.
- Still thinking of a major? You will have plenty of company in this essay competition and group workshop.

Students must apply for admission in order to be eligible for scholarship awards. Students may compete for only one departmental scholarship.

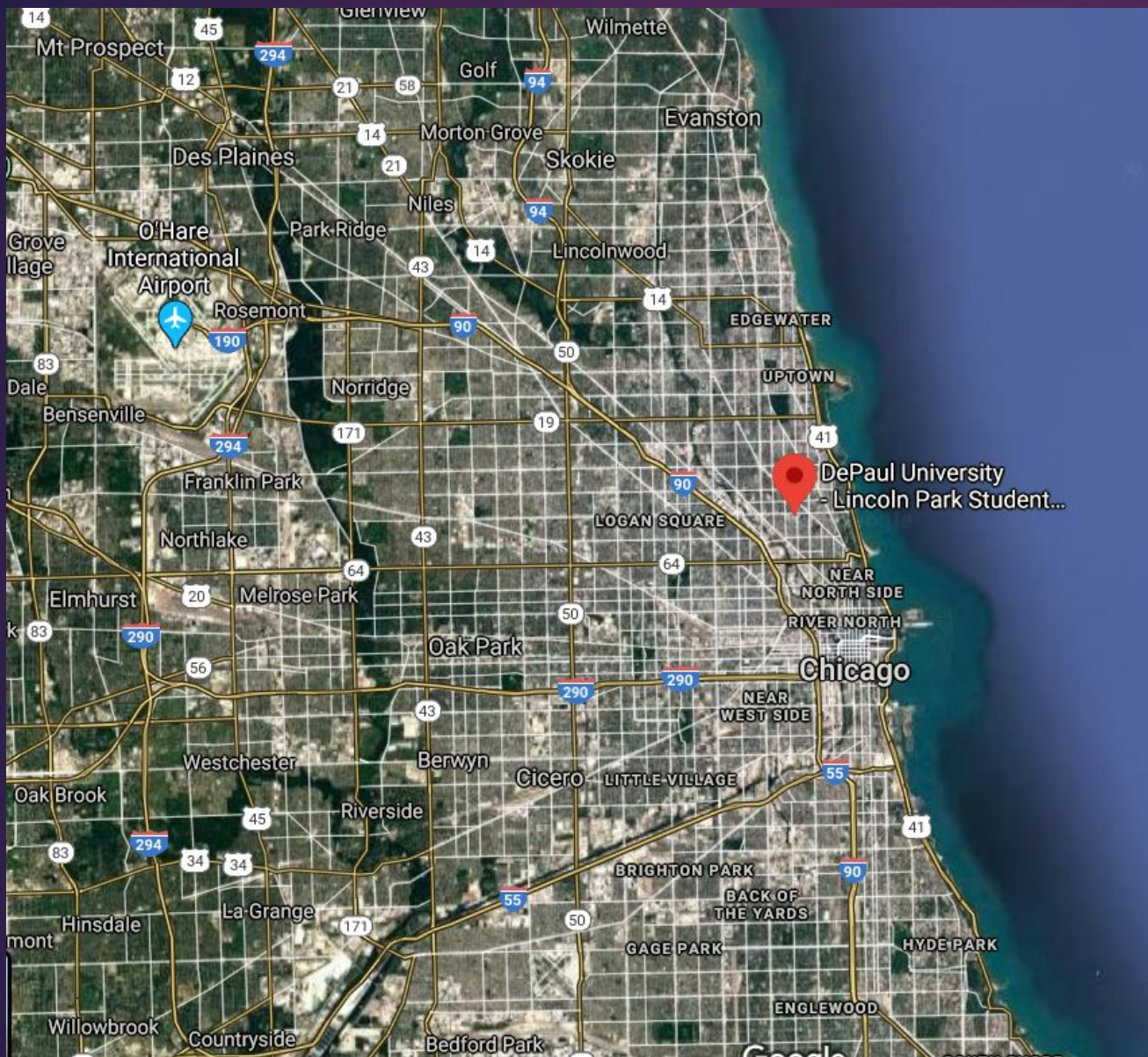

# Classical Studies (Minor)

The Classical Studies minor offers a basic grounding in Latin or Greek, along with a more in-depth exploration of at least two disciplines focusing on the history, culture, art or religion of the ancient Western world.

## Course Requirements

- Three quarters of college-level Ancient Greek or Latin (at any level).
- Five additional courses focusing on Ancient Greece or Rome from at least two different disciplines, chosen in consultation with an advisor or faculty member, from the current approved Classical Studies Allied Course List. For any of these five courses students are strongly encouraged to substitute any intermediate level course in Ancient Greek or Latin.



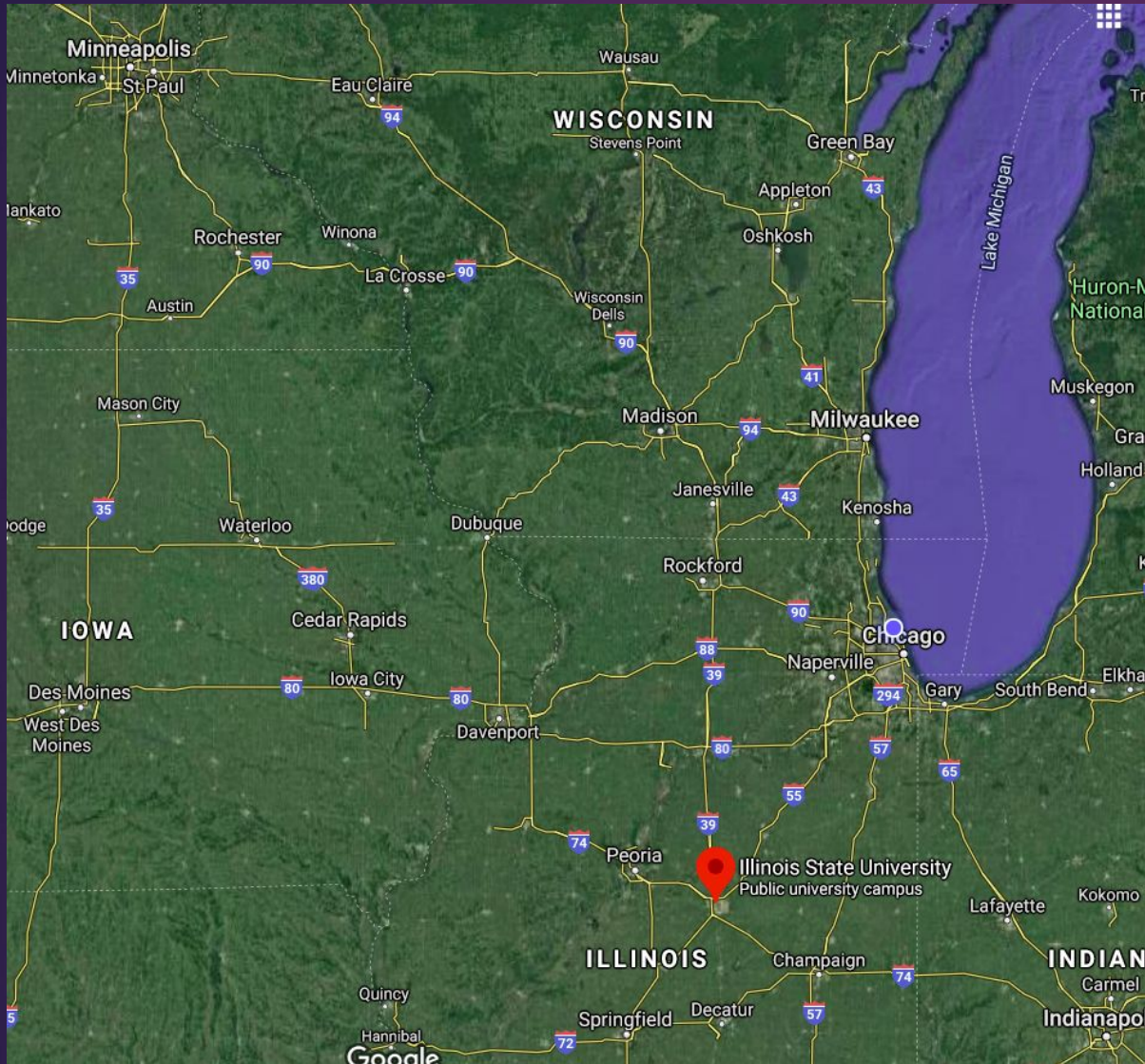

# Classical Studies

## Overview

The Classical Studies minor offers an interdisciplinary approach to the study of Classical Antiquity. It includes three courses in the Latin language, from beginning to intermediate Latin.

Beyond Latin, students of Classical Studies have the opportunity to choose from several electives in Greek, Roman, and Near Eastern Art and Archaeology, Greek and Roman history, medieval history, Italian Renaissance history, and medieval philosophy. Students of Latin are strongly encouraged to study abroad where they may earn credit for several of these courses.

The minor imparts skills in critical reading, and the evaluation and interpretation of evidence; it prepares students for careers in a variety of fields, such as law, medicine, the sciences, museum science, library science, education, and journalism.

## Why study Classical Studies?

Arguably no other language has had more influence on modern Western culture than Latin. Latin was the language of literature, philosophy, diplomacy, law, science, history, and theology for centuries in Europe. Latin remains the official language of the Vatican to this day, and it continues to be spoken in living Latin programs in both the U.S. and abroad.

There are so many reasons to study Latin. Classical studies reveal the roots of our own modern American culture. And why not read about the triumph of Caesar in Gaul, the conquest of Italy recounted by Livy, or the eruption of Vesuvius described by Pliny the Younger in the original Latin? Because Latin was used throughout Europe as a scholarly language, even if you are not a student of history or literature, learning Latin can help grow your English vocabulary; roughly half of the English language is borrowed from Latin. Knowledge of Latin terms would be also indispensable for anyone pursuing study in the fields of law, medicine, and the sciences.

Courses taken in Italy may count toward completion of the Classical Studies minor. Pre-approved year-round study abroad programs are provided by the Lorenzo de' Medici Institute. Locations of study include Rome, Florence, and Tuscania. The [ISU in Orvieto summer program](#) is also available to students pursuing a Classical Studies minor.

## Knox College Classics

### *What is Classics?*

Classics is an interdisciplinary program made up of the study of ancient languages and cultures, history, art, architecture, and philosophy. At Knox, our focus is geographically and temporally broad, encompassing the entire ancient Mediterranean and the lasting impact of its cultures over time. We have two tracks: Classical Languages and Classics and Ancient Mediterranean Studies.

### *What's it like to study Classics at Knox?*

Students in the **Classical Languages** track focus on intensive language study during their first year of course work in preparation for reading and interpreting authentic texts for the remainder of the program. It's different from learning a modern language. The focus is on linguistic structure and vocabulary rather than person-to-person communication. That makes it a great preparation for future study of ancient and modern languages.

In the **Classics and Ancient Mediterranean Studies** track, after some introductory language course work, students take most courses in English translation. It's an immersion into the breadth of ancient culture—history, art, philosophy, politics, and literature—that helps students better understand the world we live in today.

## Awards and honors

Each year, the Classics Department presents prizes and awards for outstanding achievement in Classics, Latin, Greek and archaeology: Virginia K. Hellenga Prize for Excellence in Latin, Vicki Wine Prize for Excellence in Greek and the following:

### Harold J. Ralston Classics Writing Prize

This annual writing contest for works written in English on classical themes is open to students enrolled full or part time during the academic year. Prize money of up to \$350 will be divided between however many submissions are determined to be particularly excellent. Students' entries may be in the form of an essay, short story, play, poem or any form of original writing.

### Bernice L. Fox Classics Writing Contest

The contest is open to any student enrolled full-time in high school, anywhere in the world, during the current school year. An award of \$250 will be given to the author of the best entry. The writing can be a short story, essay, play, poem, or original literary work. The topic changes each year.

## Eta Sigma Phi

Classics students hold leadership positions at the national level and receive awards from organizations such as the Classical Association.



We've taken students to the annual Eta Sigma Phi, the national undergraduate Classics honor society, meeting for more than 70 years.

## Careers

Students who major in classics, Greek or Latin develop skills in research, problem-solving and communication that are applicable to many fields. Career paths for classics graduates include: museum curating, historical preservation, archival work, Latin teacher, library science, law, government, literary editing and publishing, or higher education.



## Classics are for everyone

**Courses** are for students who major or minor in classics or classical languages, but they are also open to all students who seek intellectual enrichment or a broader perspective of the world. (Hello, double major.) Students who have an interest in politics, art, religion, philosophy, literature, drama, gender relations, class relations, intercultural dynamics and social institutions will find all of that in our program.

## We get hands-on

Our campus **archaeology lab** and the Shields Collection of Antiquities hold authentic ancient artifacts. Our department also houses an expansive collection of historic reproductions and clothing relevant to the ancient world. These materials are used to illustrate a range of topics, including ancient sports, warfare, textile and food production, art, and other practices of life in the ancient world.

Students also enhance their knowledge and build cross-disciplinary connections by engaging with faculty from the arts and sciences and with physical resources such as the **ceramics studio**, LeSuer Nature Preserve, the **Educational Garden & Farm**, and the local **Warren County History Museum**.

## Writing the Book on the Environment in the Classical World

Upcoming book by classics professor **Adrienne Hagen** will focus on nature and environment in ancient world.



**MONMOUTH, ILL.** – A Monmouth College professor who is blazing a trail in her teaching will now write a book to help others follow in her path.

Classics professor **Adrienne Hagen** recently signed a contract with Routledge for a book titled *Nature and the Environment in Greek and Roman Thought: A Sourcebook*. It is scheduled to be published in 2023.



Hagen, who joined the faculty in 2018, teaches a course on "Nature and the Environment in Antiquity." She's had to assemble all of the primary resources for the class, including some developed while writing her doctoral dissertation at the University of Wisconsin.

## A Novella Approach

**Emma Vanderpool '17** has found niche writing educational novellas in Latin.



**MONMOUTH, ILL.** – Monmouth College alumna **Emma Vanderpool '17** has authored five novellas in Latin, with another two on the way later this fall.



Vanderpool will shortly begin her first year teaching Latin at Springfield Honors Academy in Springfield, Mass., not far from the University of Massachusetts, where she earned her master's degree in 2019, as well as the Distinguished Teaching Award.

She said her novellas are a response to "a shift in teaching Latin to comprehensible input," which is understandable language input that is just one step beyond the student's current level.

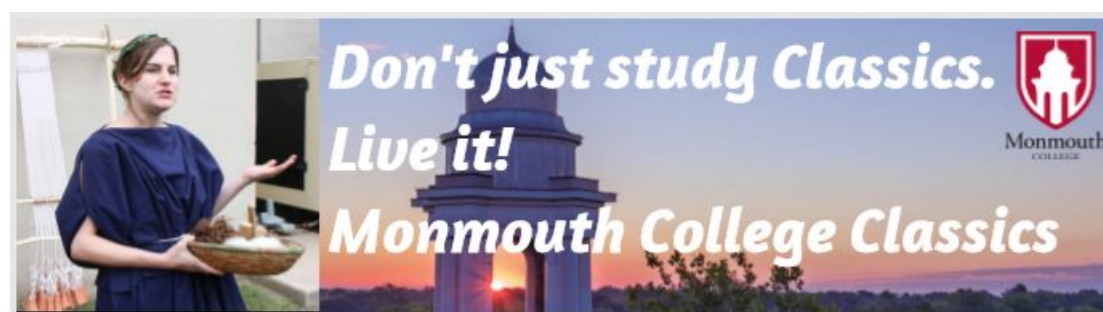


## Classics Awards, Scholarships, and Honors

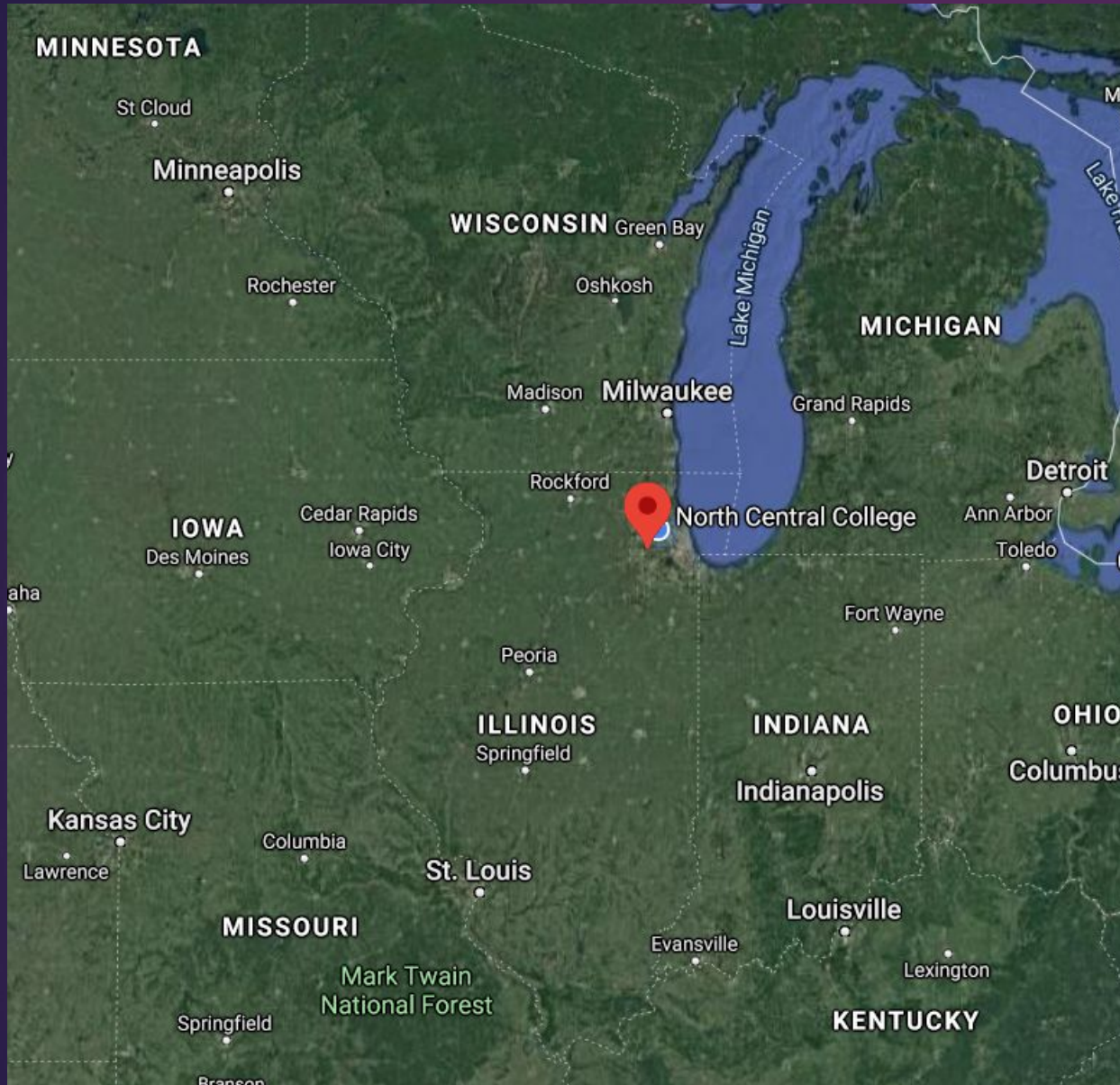

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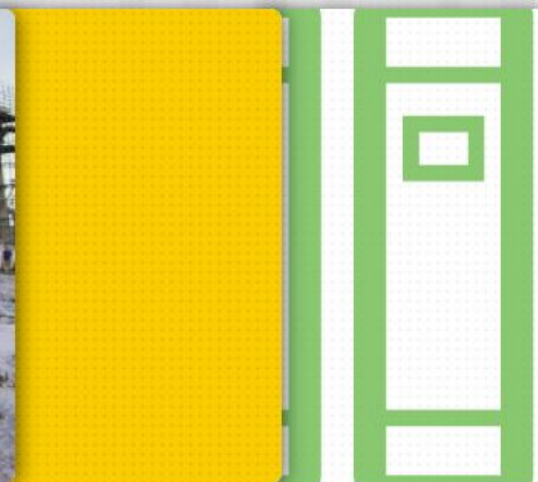

## Classical Studies Minor

Classical Studies is an interdisciplinary program that explores all aspects of the ancient Greek and Roman worlds. It offers language courses in ancient Greek and Latin as well as courses in cultural studies. Students pursuing the minor also draw on coursework in History, Art History, Philosophy, Religious Studies, Theater, and Great Books. The minor is a useful complement to studies in any of these fields. It is especially recommended to students who plan to pursue graduate studies requiring knowledge of ancient Greek or Latin (such as programs in ancient history, classical archaeology, medieval studies, and many seminaries). Minors in Classical Studies build skills in close reading, research, and analysis of texts and objects that are applicable to wide range of occupations and careers.

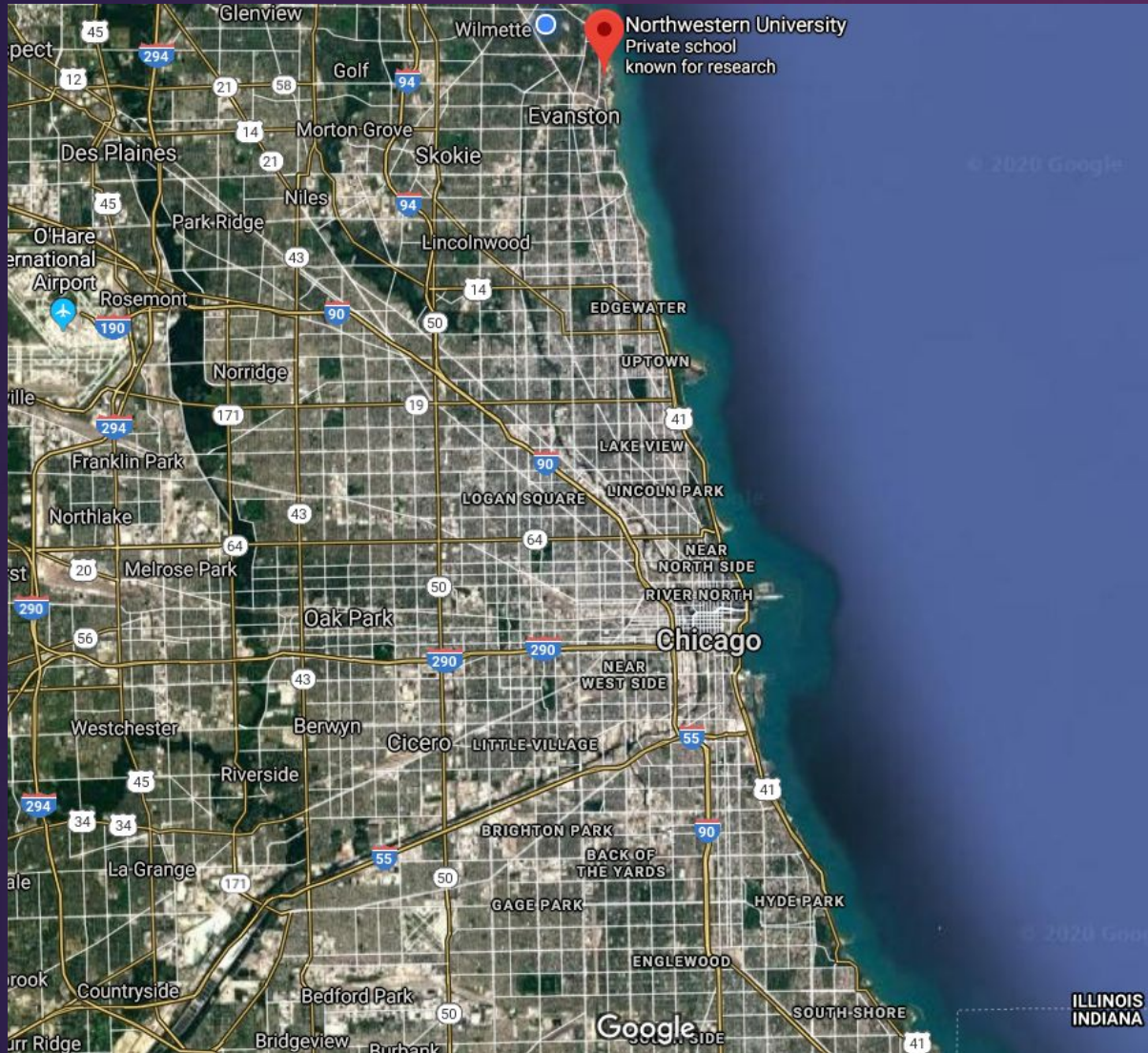

# LATIN AT NORTHWESTERN

## DID YOU KNOW ?

- About 60% of all English words derive from Latin. First year Latin students add an average of 20,000 new English words to their vocabularies.
- Learning Latin will give you facility with much modern scientific, medical, and legal terminology.
- Latin will give you the strongest single foundation for mastering Romance languages (Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, French, Romanian) , the direct linguistic inheritors of Latin.
- Studies conducted by the Educational Testing Service show that Latin students consistently outperform all other students on the verbal portion of the SAT.
- Classics majors consistently have some of the highest scores on GREs of all undergraduates.

## WHY LEARN LATIN?

- Latin is the language of the ancient Romans, who ruled much of the world for over 1000 years; built roads and aqueducts that are still used today; extended their citizenship to peoples across Europe, North Africa, and Asia; created Roman law and political institutions on which many modern systems including the American one are founded.
- Ancient Rome has given us a template and a vocabulary that continue to define the way we understand Western culture. Its study plays a crucial role in an increasingly globalized world and can help us gain a critical view of our position in it.
- All of our classes provide stimulating, demanding material, and develop skills in writing, critical analysis, and the exploration of other cultures.
- Latin students are well prepared to succeed after college. Our majors have gone on to graduate school and employment in fields as varied as medicine, law, clean energy consultancies, client diplomacy for an investment management company, or have pursued advanced degrees in art history, computer science, and even Classics!

Greek 301 – Subject changes each term, showcasing the wide variety of Greek literature.

## Minor in Classical Studies

The minor in classical studies is a multidisciplinary program sponsored by the College of Arts and Sciences and supported by the Departments of Art and Design; English Language and Literature; Foreign Languages and Literature; History; and Philosophy.

The classical studies minor contributes to cultural enrichment through the study of Latin and Greek, and of the history, philosophy, literature, and art of the Greek and Roman civilizations; to language sensitivity by close attention to the grammatical and syntactical structure of Latin and/or Greek and by careful analysis of texts; to expansion of a general working vocabulary; and to knowledge of special vocabularies of such fields as medicine, law, theology and foreign languages derived from Latin and Greek.

### Requirements

The minor in classical studies requires 20 credit hours of courses designated classical studies. Of these, eight hours are required in Greek or in Latin. Credit is granted only for courses in which grades of C or above are earned.

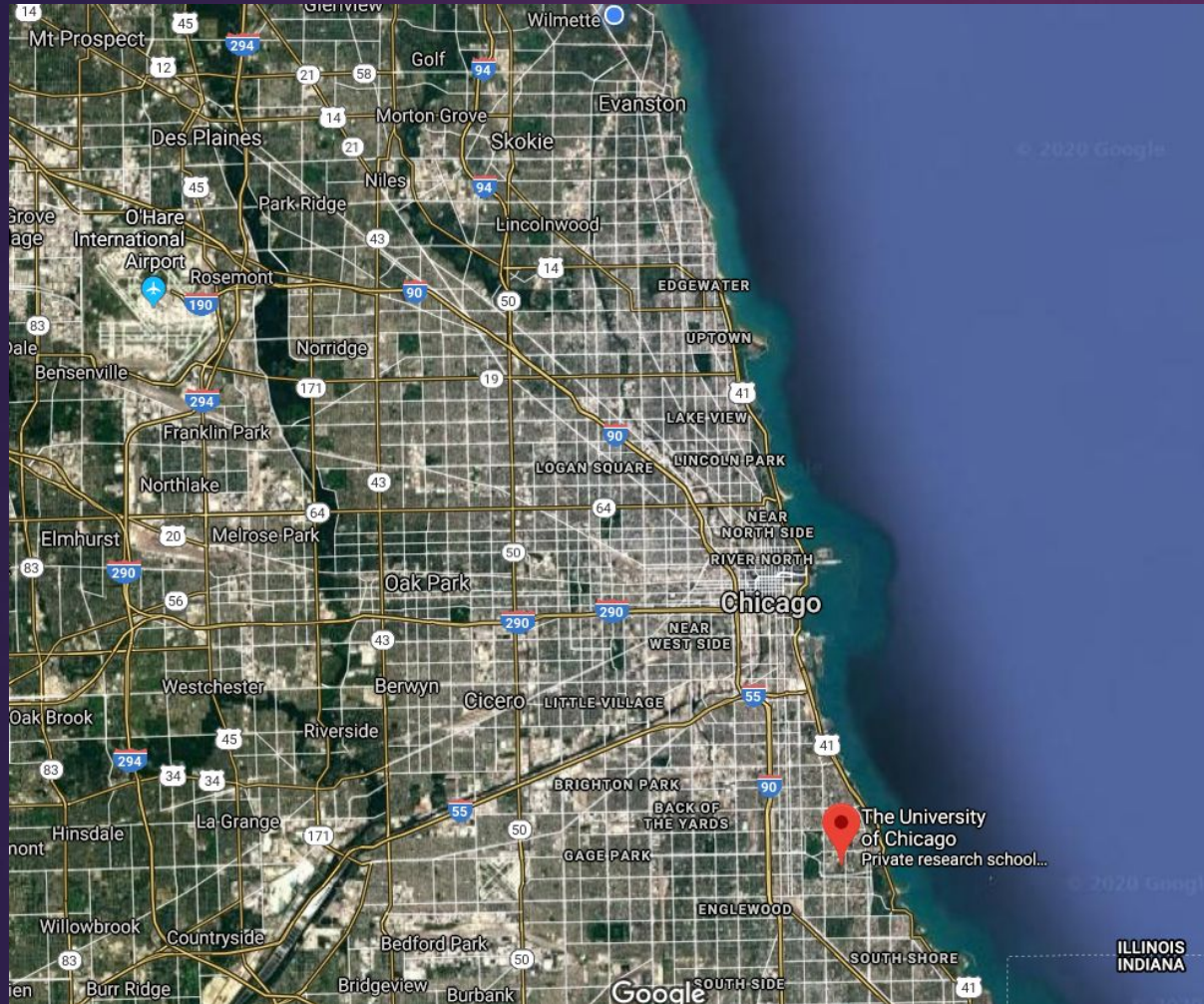

The B.A. degree in Classical Studies allows students to explore Greek and Roman antiquity in a variety of ways and provides excellent preparation for careers that require strong skills in interpretation and writing, such as teaching, scholarly research, law, and publishing, and in the humanities in general. - The **Greek and Roman Cultures Variant** emphasizes courses in art and archaeology, history, material culture, and texts in translation.
- The **Language Intensive Variant** focuses on languages with the aim of reading a larger selection of texts in the original languages; it is designed especially for those who wish to pursue graduate studies in classics.
- The **Language and Literature Variant** combines the study of Greek and Latin texts with coverage of diverse areas, including art and archaeology, history, philosophy, religion, and science.

## Prizes and Grants

### Offered through the College:

Among the grants offered through the College, the following have sometimes been held by students in Classics:

The **Third-Year International Travel Grant** supports (up to \$4000) BA-level research outside the United States.

The **Foreign Language Acquisition Grant (FLAG)** supports (up to \$4000) intensive intermediate or advanced language study abroad.

The application deadline for all three is **on February 8, 2020**. The College holds information sessions about these awards periodically between November and February. Information may be found online from the College **SITG** (Summer International Travel Grants).

### Offered through the Classics Department:

The **Arthur Adkins Summer Research Fellowship** is expected to be worth \$5000 this year. The fellowship is targeted to third-year undergraduates who are bound for graduate school, and it provides means and opportunity for the writing of a superior research paper on any aspect of the ancient world from the Bronze Age through Late Antiquity. It may be used for travel to classical sites and collections or to other research centers, and/or for living expenses during a summer devoted to research between the third and fourth year. Applicants must submit to the Classics Administrator (**by Monday, April 6, 2020**) a transcript, a statement (2-3 pages) outlining their project and its relationship to existing knowledge in the field, a plan of research together with a provisional budget for the summer, and a letter from a faculty

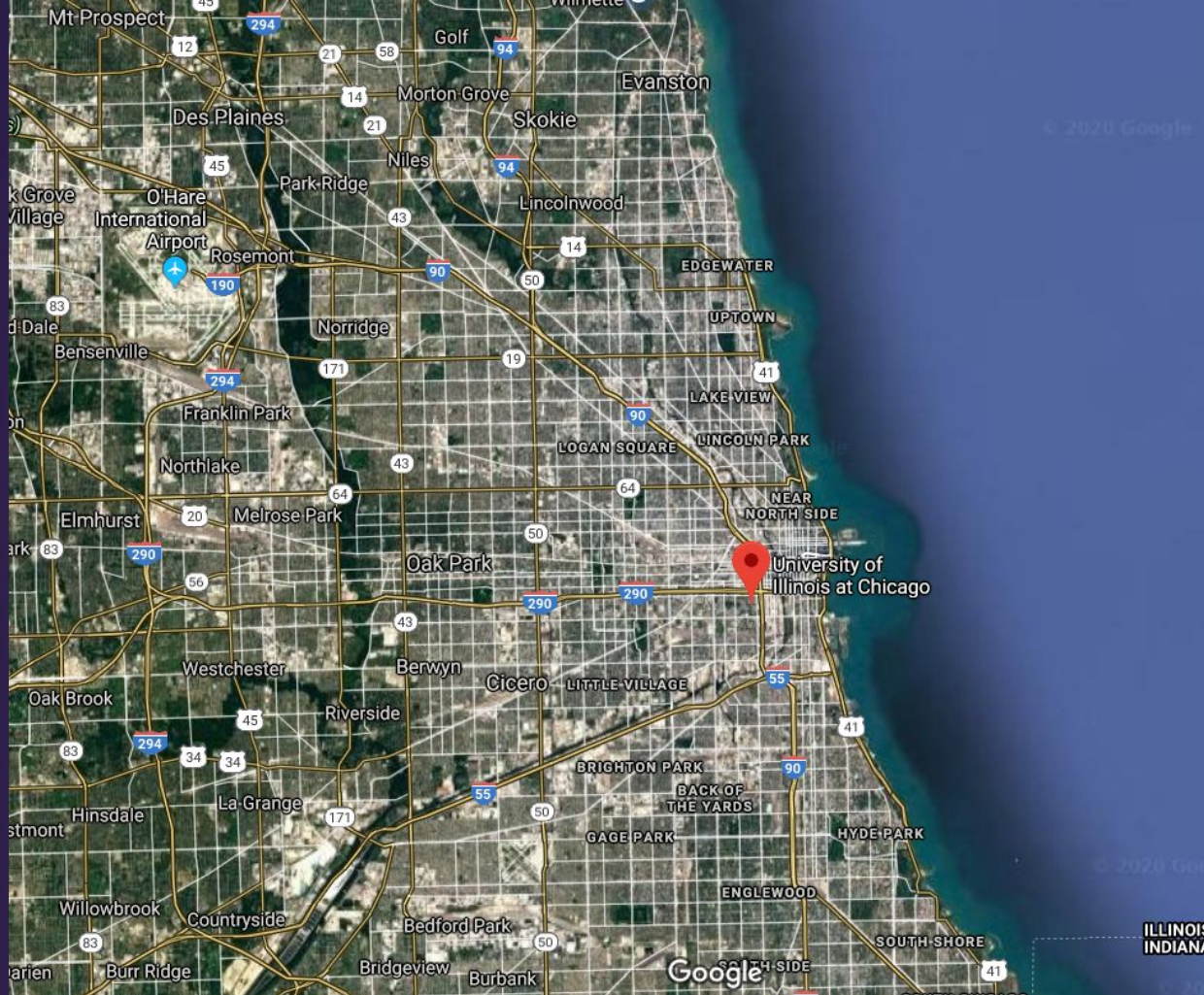

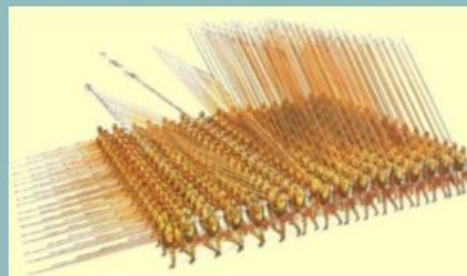

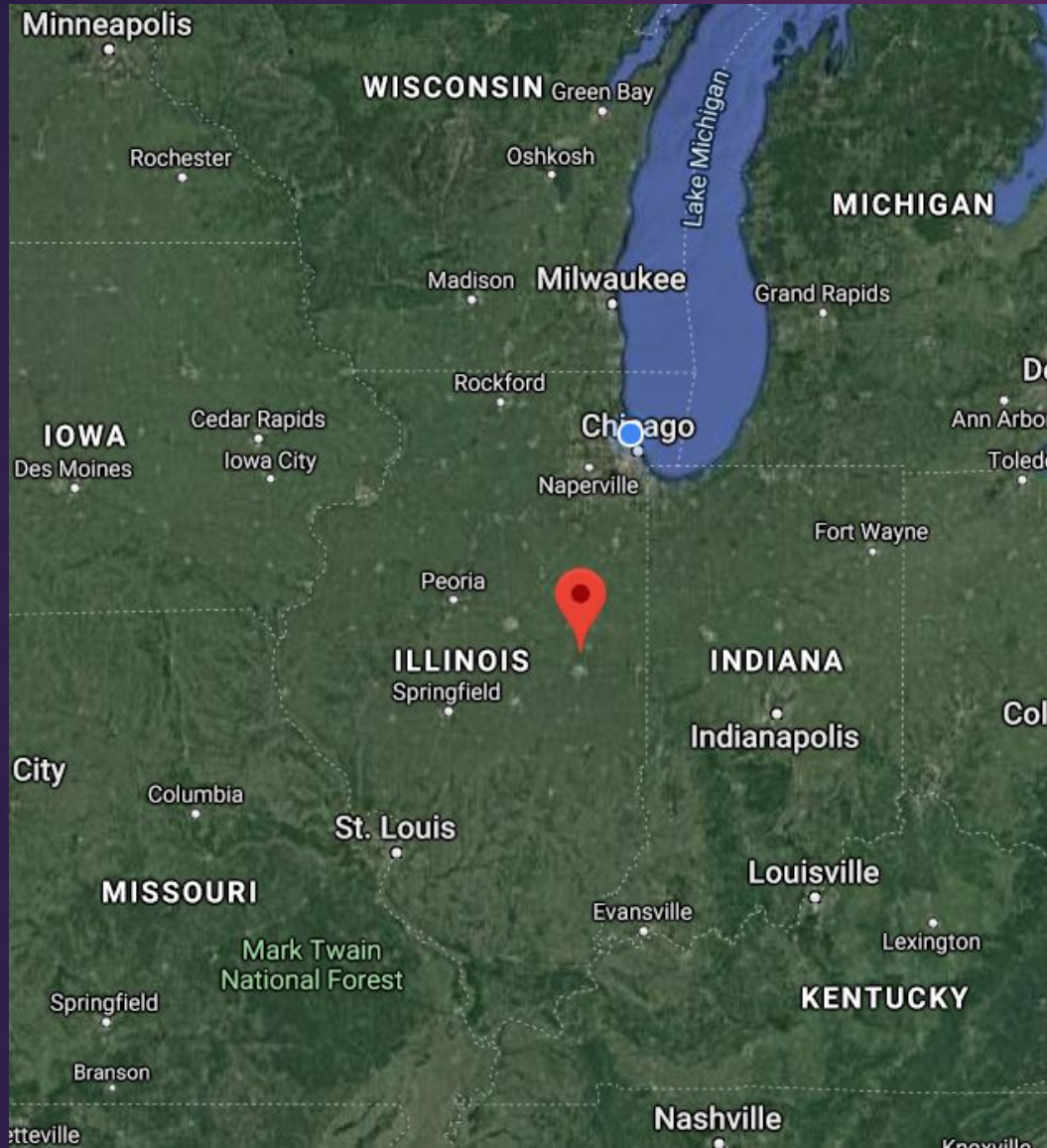

Are you interested in the language, history, art, and culture of ancient Greece and Rome? Are you interested in applying lessons of the past to the 21st century? You should study Classics at Illinois.

Students can study Classics through classes like Mythology of Greece and Rome, Introduction to Greek Culture, Classics and US Minorities, Medical Terms, and many more. We also offer a four-semester introductory sequence in both Greek and Latin, as well as intermediate and advanced classes. Most of our classical civilization classes fulfill general education requirements and some are offered online.

### Our program

For those wishing to become more deeply immersed, we offer both a minor and major. The minor requires 18 hours (with specialization in Classical Civilizations, Ancient Greek, Modern Greek, and Latin), and the major 32 hours and 12 hours in electives. Students pursuing a bachelor's degree can choose one of two concentrations:

- Classical civilization (with an optional track in Mediterranean Archaeology)
- Classical Languages (with three tracks, Ancient Greek, Latin, Ancient Greek and Latin)

Students who already know some Latin or Greek are welcome. Anyone can consult the department about placement at any time.

Classics majors sometimes pair their studies in our department with a second major. Popular second majors include economics, English, history, political science, and many of the sciences.

Our undergraduates often go to law school or medical school and pursue careers in education, business, and journalism. Some choose to stay at Illinois to complete one of our graduate degrees.

Classics faculty have interests ranging from epic poetry, drama and gender studies to philosophy, film, and ecocriticism. Because our classes tend to be small, students learn directly from faculty who are experts in their fields.

### Resources and opportunities

- The **University Library** is the largest public university library in North America. It holds more than 14 million volumes and is known for its Classics collection, which is ranked in the top three in the country.
- The **Krannert Art Museum** and the **Spurlock Museum** house a substantial collection of Greek vases and one of the most important collections of South Italian pottery in North America. The Spurlock also has an outstanding collection of Greek and Roman coins, striking plaster casts of some of the most famous sculptures of antiquity, and thousands of artifacts illustrating the cultures of the ancient Mediterranean.
- Classics hosts **talks** several times a month and conferences at least once a year with visiting speakers from major universities in North America and Europe. The local chapter of the Archaeological Institute of America also sponsors a series of lectures every semester.
- Our students can **study abroad** through our own Illinois in Athens program or various faculty-led trips, or in several English-language programs including the College Year in Athens, and the Intercollegiate Center (Rome), as well as programs in the United Kingdom.
